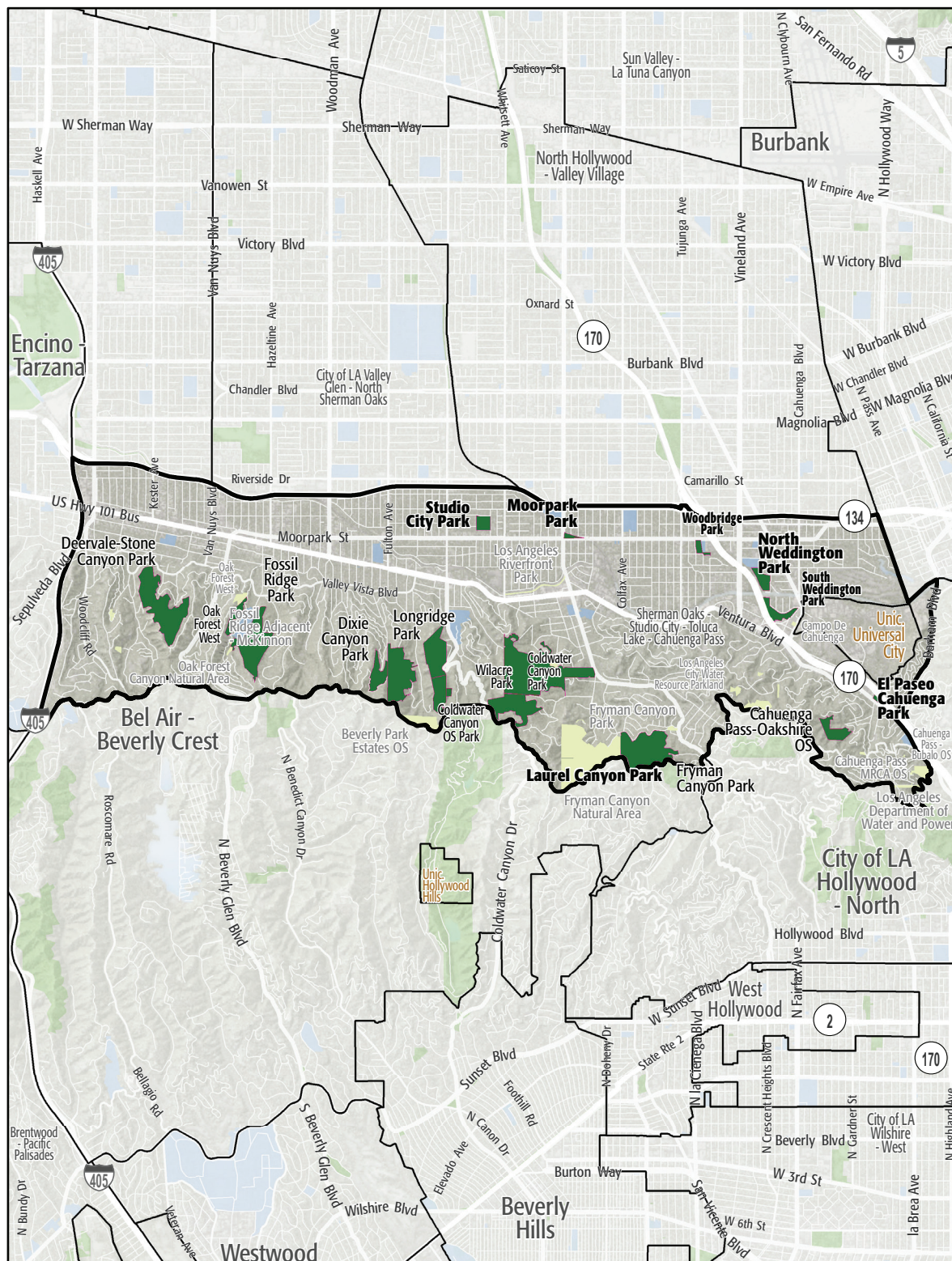

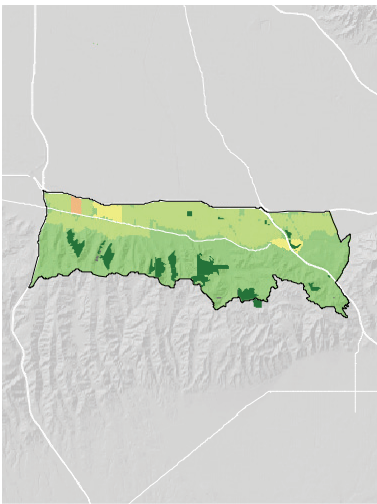

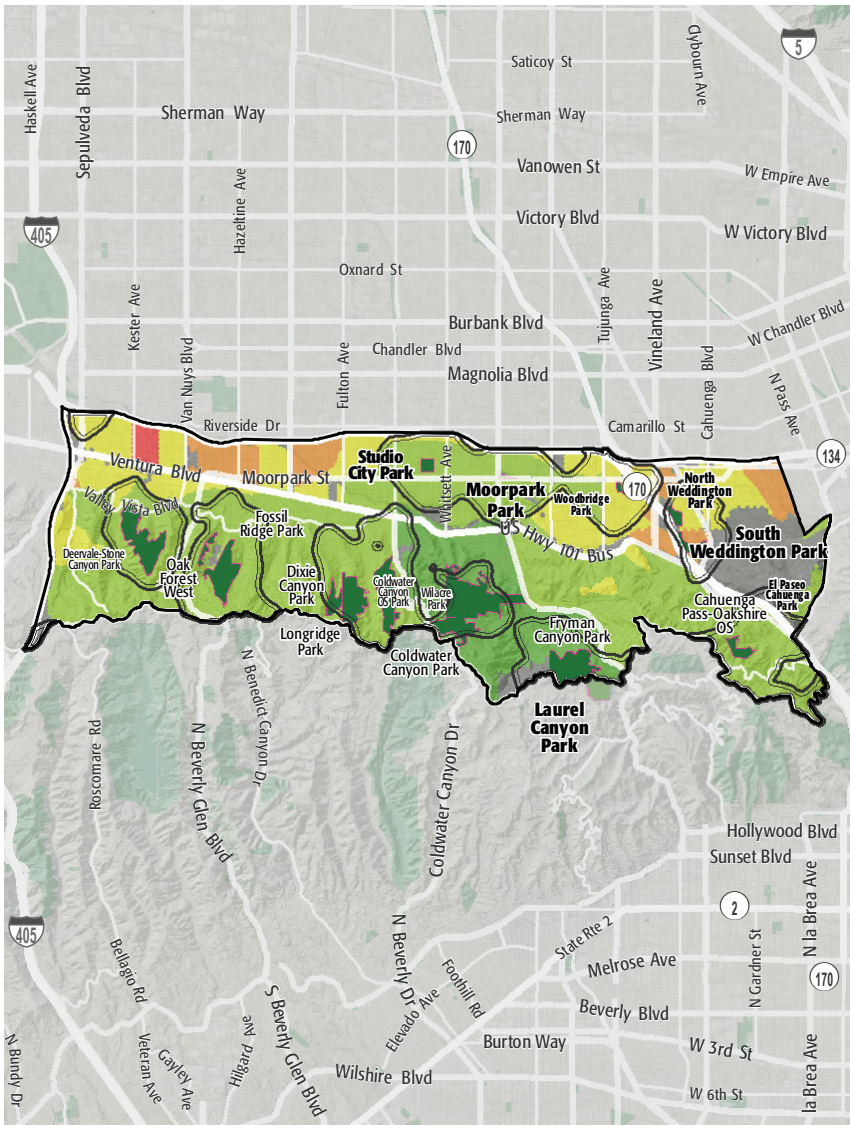
WHERE ARE PARKS MOST NEEDED?

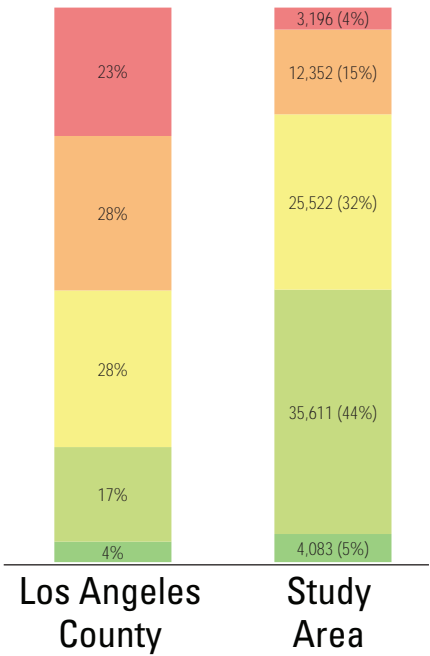
