



### POPULATION DENSITY





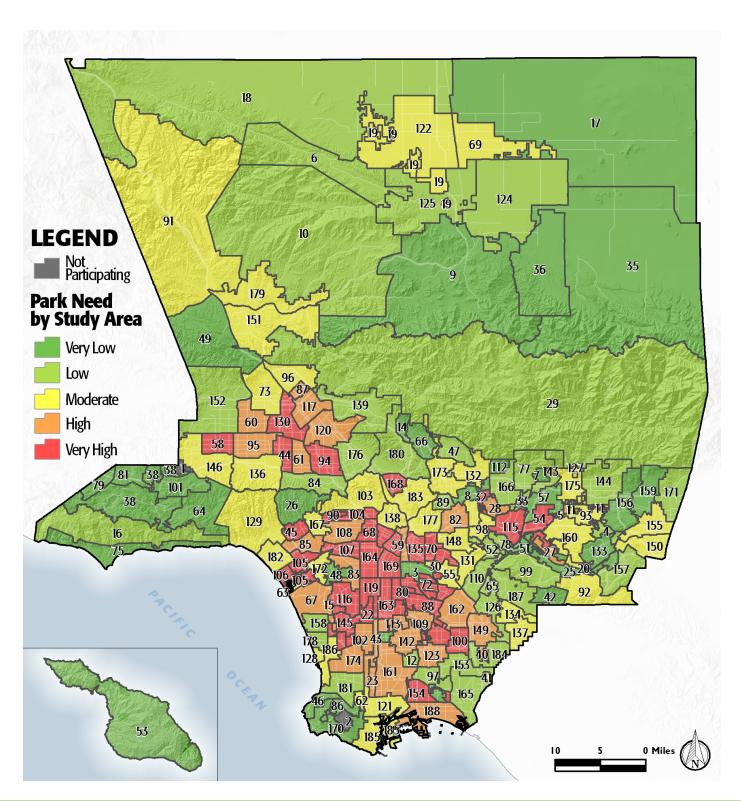
