

# APPENDIX B RURAL STUDY AREA PROFILES

This project was previously called the Regional and Rural Edition (RRE) to emphasize its focus on regional and rural recreation needs and priorities. This project name was used during the data collection, and community engagement and outreach phases which occurred primarily in 2021. As this report was being completed in 2022, DPR decided to rename the project the Parks Needs Assessment Plus (PNA+) to clarify and better communicate that this project complements and offers new information not previously included in the 2016 Parks Needs Assessment (PNA), such as mapping and analyses related to population vulnerability, environmental benefits, environmental burdens, and priority areas for environmental conservation, environmental restoration, regional recreation, and rural recreation. (Please note that there remains some text and graphic references to the RRE in this document because that was the project name when some components of this study were completed.)

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## **STUDY AREA DESCRIPTION**

#### **PHYSICAL CONTEXT**

The Northwest Antelope Valley Study Area is located in the Antelope Valley Regional Study Area. The Northwest Antelope Valley Study Area is bordered by the cities of Lancaster and Palmdale to the east, the Angeles National Forest to the south, the Los Padres National Forest to the west, and the Tehachapi mountains and high desert in Kern County to the north. The Study Area encompasses approximately 309 square miles. The unincorporated communities of Gorman, Del Sur, Antelope Acres, Neenach, and Three Points are in the Northwest Antelope Valley Study Area.

#### **STUDY AREA CONSIDERATIONS**

The Study Area has major constraints, including natural hazards, such as earthquakes and extreme heat, lack of infrastructure, including public transit service, and limited water supply. It is critical that existing rural communities, agriculture, natural resources, and biological diversity remain protected. The desirability of rural living and the availability of affordable housing have led to significant growth in some unincorporated communities. In turn, many residents have had to commute further distances to access employment opportunities. Employment opportunities and schools continue to operate in more populated areas of the Antelope Valley. As a result, many residents in the Study Area commute long distances to schools and workplaces.


#### **KEY ANALYSIS TAKEAWAYS**

- » Transportation barriers are the most prevalent dimension of population vulnerability in the Study Area.
  - » Only 1% of residents live within walking distance of a rural recreation site.
  - » Only 11% of residents live within cycling distance of a rural recreation site.
  - » No rural recreation sites in the Study Area are served by public transit.
- » The majority of rural recreation site area in the Study Area falls under Nature-Based Recreation Area. The Study Area contains no Local Park or Regional Recreational Park area.
- » Study Area residents live within proximity to very few types of recreation opportunities.
  - » A very small proportion of Study Area residents live within a 5-mile drive of water-based recreation opportunities (0.9%), overnight accommodations (6%), sports facilities (7.3%), general recreation facilities (6.4%), and health and fitness facilities (6.4%).
- » All three indicators of rural recreation priority (high population vulnerability, low proximity to rural recreation sites and proximity to the fewest recreation opportunity types) are pronounced in the Study Area.

#### KEY COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT TAKEAWAYS

- » Time, distance, safety and lack of information about activities and facilities are identified barriers to park use for residents who live in the Study Area.
- » Residents say they need more local recreation facilities and greenspaces, safe places to ride bikes, and more places for community and cultural events.
- » Greatest needs are for places to swim; spaces to gather with friends and family; places to play and to be surrounded by nature.
- » 43% of survey respondents say they are recreating outside less often due to COVID, and twice that number (86%) are looking for more recreation activities closer to home.






## **COMPOSITE POPULATION VULNERABILITY**




ACRES OF RURAL RECREATION AND CONSERVATION AREA LAND PER 1000 STUDY AREA RESIDENTS










OF STUDY AREA RESIDENTS LIVE WITHIN CYCLING DISTANCE OF A RURAL RECREATION SITE

















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## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT THEMES**

#### **BARRIERS RESIDENTS EXPERIENCE TO USING PARKS AND FACILITIES**



#### HEAT

Heat, especially in summer, limits what people can do outside.



#### LACK OF SHADE

Few places to sit or gather in the shade at parks in the Study Area.



#### LIMITED ACCESS TO WATER

There is a lack of water facilities and features like fountains, swimming pools and splash pads to keep residents cool and hydrated in hot months.



#### DISTANCE

Many residents and families have to travel long distances to parks and facilities and would rather walk or bike to nearby parks.



#### LACK OF GREEN SPACE

There are not enough parks and green spaces in communities in the Study Area.



#### **SAFETY CONCERNS**

Residents don't feel safe at parks. Safer bike riding opportunities for youth and families near parks and along streets are needed.

## LACK OF FACILITIES AND PROGRAMMING

Nearby parks lack basketball courts, skate areas and swimming pools, and provide few activities for residents to participate in.

#### LIMITED HOURS

Facilities are not open when people can use them.

#### LIMITED ADA ACCESSIBILITY

Limited opportunities for seniors and those with disabilities to use parks and facilities. "Gas money to drive stops me from doing more things with my grandkids."

"We really don't have anything classified as a "park" close to home."

"No safe place to ride bikes with kids near me."

"The weather—usually too hot and/or too windy."



## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT THEMES**

#### COMMUNITY SUGGESTIONS TO INCREASE AND IMPROVE VISITS TO BUBAL PARKS AND FACILITIES



#### **MORE SHADE**

Shaded seating, play areas and walking trails, and more trees between and around parks.



#### **ACCESS TO WATER**

Additional water facilities and features like swimming pools and splash pads to keep residents cool in hot months.



#### **MORE PARKS AND GREENSPACE**

Reduce distance residents have to travel to parks by creating pocket parks and other local greenspace in the study area.



#### **EXPANDED RECREATION** FACILITIES

Extend facility hours, and provide more basketball courts, sports fields, swimming facilities, skate parks, and places to run and walk dogs.



#### **IMPROVE ADA ACCESSIBILITY AT PARKS**

Provide wheelchair and disabled accessible parks and facilities.



#### **EXPAND COMMUNITY AND CULTURAL EVENTS**

Provide more music and movie nights and open up park spaces for the community to hold more events.

#### **MORE TRAILS FOR PEDESTRIAN USE**

Additional trails for walking, jogging and bike riding.

#### **ENHANCED CONNECTIVITY**

Provide greenways and trail networks that connect parks and provide safe transportation corridors for bicyclists, equestrians and pedestrians.

#### IMPROVED **INFRASTRUCTURE**






## **RURAL RECREATION PRIORITY ANALYSIS**

Areas Experiencing the Highest Levels of Overall Population Vulnerability






#### Areas Located in Low Proximity to Rural Recreation Sites




